

## **NBEMS Net Script**

**( Read the Bold text)**

**This is (mycall) calling the CCAR NBEMS net**

**My name is ..... I will be the NCS**

**The purpose of this net is for training & practice in  
passing digital message traffic.**

**This directed net meets every Thursday evening  
at approx: 1950 LT following the CCAR voice net.**

**Anyone having questions about NBEMS or this net can contact [n3fll@arrl.net](mailto:n3fll@arrl.net)**

**The net will now open for check-ins all licensed amateur  
radio operators are welcome to check-in, you do not  
need to be a CCAR member.**

**The opening script will use Thor 100, then for check-ins  
we will change to Thor 22, both centered on 1500 Hz.**

**Be sure your RxID is on and Flamp is open. There is no  
need for TxID to check-in. Also AFC ( lower right) should be off at all times.**

**(Use Fldigi for the following )**

**Transmit the opening script using Thor 100**

**Change to Thor 22 and begin taking check-ins (QNI)  
by CCAR regions and then outside of Chester Co.**

**Acknowledge (QNS) check-ins using Fldigi**

**After all regions and out of county check-ins are  
acknowledged send the Messages macro.**

**ID at least every 10 min.**

**By voice:**

Review the list of check-ins and mention those with traffic.

This is a good time to mention signal levels

that are too high or too low. ( n3fll can confirm

if a station is too high or too low)

Call for additional check-ins.

Call for stations to send traffic , reminding them

to have there TxID on and receiving stations to

have there RxID on and AFC should be off

ID at least every 10 minutes

After all traffic is passed:

**By voice:**

**This will be the last call for additional check-ins additional stations call now:**

**We now will close the net using Roll Call checkout procedure.**

After the last station clears
